

# HEALING STORY ALLIANCE, INC. ANNUAL REPORT 2024

### OVERVIEW OF OUR YEAR

This past year, 2024, was the Healing Story Alliance's second full year of nonprofit status. HSA has increased its outreach, collaborations, and mission driven programming. Importantly HSA is attracting both consistent financial support through ticket sales and donations and a growing audience for its programs in support of storytelling as a healing art.

### Organizational Structure

With Not-for-Profit Corporate Status in New York State and Federal Recognition of 501(c) 3 status now in place, the HSA Board of Directors met every few months in 2024 to oversee HSA's fiscal, programmatic, technology, and policy affairs. The Board oversees that all HSA's initiatives are in keeping with HSA's vision as a service organization and its purpose to educate the general public about the applied use of storytelling in the healing arts and professions through live and virtual public cultural programs and online literary resources.

HSA is dedicated to storytelling as a healing art and its programs promote the healing of self, community, society, and the Earth. We aspire to collaborate with other like-minded organizations.

Our first annual 990N was filed in a timely fashion with the IRS and a Charities Registration form (CHAR 500) was filed with the NY State Dept of State.

The HSA Board met four times over the course of 2024 and sought to address, clarify, and act on those topics, issues, and concerns raised or discussed in monthly Advisory/Programming Meetings. The HSA Board discussions focused on

- Exploring ways to expand and energize board leadership with a view to lead HSA sustainably into the future.
- Exploring ways to expand HSA's audience and outreach with events and offerings that address current relevant needs and concerns of larger and more diverse populations.

- Exploring ways to expand offerings without increasing burnout of Advisory/Program Committee, staff, and other volunteers.
- Expanding our reach and impact by identifying other organizations which relate to our mission and with whom we could collaborate.

Healing Story Alliance's Advisory/Program committee currently meets on the third Wednesday of the month from 7:00pm – 9:00pm to design and devise practical ways to implement mission driven programs aligned with HSA's purpose to educate the general public about the applied use of storytelling in the healing arts and professions through live and virtual public cultural programs and online literary resources. HSA's mission driven programming promotes the use of storytelling to heal the self, community, society, and the Earth.

To this end thirty-seven cultural programs were produced in 2024 including:

- 23 free OARS in the Water Programs
- 7 free Kind Stories Concerts
- 4 Special Ticketed Events
- 3 Author Interviews

The HSA Website was maintained by Heather Forest and Dot Cleveland. Media content was expanded to include an archive of *Kind Stories in Concert* and an array of available viewing tickets for past programs

Since her hiring, Dot has accurately maintained HSA's bookkeeping on Quicken, produced monthly fiscal reports, maintained a monthly Mailchimp newsletter, and contributed to overall program promotional outreach to listserves and Facebook pages.

Keeping our mission central to all decision-making has distinguished the Healing Story Alliance from other storytelling organizations through our mission-driven programming and resource offerings.

#### **Expanded Outreach**

In order to provide access, education, and resources to the general public on the topic of healing story, HSA throughout 2024, has worked to expand its outreach through multiple channels including:

### **Fostering Global Community and Strengthening Attendee Participation**

The Oars in The Water program was conceived in March 2020, a time of global and personal isolation, anxiety, grief and uncertainty, in response to a felt and perceived need among a group of HSA storytellers for a place of comfort, connection, consolation and community. In the intervening five years, as world turbulence persists, HSA has sensed the increasing importance of creating and being in community – especially a safe, welcoming, inspiring community of shared needs, concerns, hopes and values.

In response, OARS in 2024 has strengthened its commitment to offer our attendees an even deeper, richer experience of community, one that invites open, honest communication and participation by all. As a result, our OARS community is flourishing, stronger and more connected than ever. A nationwide and international family of 30 - 50 devoted regular attendees, a steadily increasing number of new attendees and a growing roster of gifted cohosts participate in online OARS sessions year-round from 7 - 8:30pm EST on the second and fourth Wednesday of every month.

This year, OARS has also committed to and succeeded in increasing the number and variety of attendees who have served as session co-hosts. In 23 sessions, OARS hosts have offered themes that underscore the solace and resilience to be found in journeys, callings, collaborations, gratitude for the wonder and beauty of the natural world, and above all, in the sacred space of story listening and storytelling. Gentle theme-related prompts have inspired meaningful reflection and engagement by attendees in break-out rooms, followed by heartfelt community conversation.

OARS attendees describe OARS as beautiful, meaningful, comforting, poignant, inspirational, affirming, enlightening, powerful, joyful, heart-opening, and renewing – a truly welcoming, participatory community space that offers needed refuge, connection and hope in life's ongoing storms.

### Kind Stories in Concert Report 2024

"Kind Stories in Concert" is a monthly program offered by HSA, a special gathering to share and explore stories of kindness in its many facets and forms. Through folk tales and personal stories, we dive deeply into multiple experiences of kindness. During the year of 2024, we presented 7 programs. An average of 144 people registered for each free concert. The 42 presenters included both men and women; 18 of the presenters were POC. 

### SPECIAL EVENTS OVERVIEW 2024

**Chair: Lani Peterson** 

In its full second year of being a non-profit, HSA has continued to remain solvent through offering fee-based specially curated Special Event Programming to its followers. Each special event was carefully chosen to meet our mission of providing programming and resources to promote the healing of self, community, society, and the Earth. All events are priced with a sliding fee scale to ensure accessibility to people of all levels and means. Need-based scholarships are also available.

Simultaneously, presenters and facilitators are consulted prior to their engagement in a discussion of fair compensation, leading each special event to result in income for both the facilitator as well as for HSA. Over the course of 2024, 397 people purchased tickets to participate in one of The Healing Story Alliance's Special Events.

Lastly, several presenters in 2024 agreed to have their event recorded, resulting in a secondary viewing ticket, allowing followers to view the special event at their leisure at any point in the future. These viewing tickets have provided an ongoing income source for both HSA and the facilitators/presenters. Over the course of 2024, 59 viewing tickets were sold.

#### **Types of Events**

Special events can include concerts, workshops, lectures, interviews, panels, or webinars in the healing story areas of applied health and healing for the mind, body, spirit, social justice, community building, environmental/nature connections, and creativity and healing. Within the 2024 time period, seven special events occurred, including one concert, three workshops, and three author interviews. Below are summaries of the events and their impact.

#### 2024 Lineup of Special Events

#### January 7, 2024 Women's Concert



On the evening of January 7<sup>th</sup>. HSA hosted a fundraising women's concert with Laura Simms as the emcee. Female members of HSA's Advisory Committee shared a variety of personal narratives and folk tales on the theme of strong

women. Storytellers for the evening included: Noa Baum, Sara deBeer, Heather Forest, Elisa Pearmain, Lani Peterson, Penny Post, and Karianna Rosenberg.

#### March 10, 2024 Navigating Controversial Conversations Workshop




As the political campaign heated up and divisive conversations continued along party lines, HSA offered a workshop based on the work of Braver Angels. Under the quidance of skilled facilitators Reena Bernards and Tom Smerling,

workshop participants were guided to learn and practice skills to manage controversial conversations in the family and beyond. As they promised, "if you want to preserve important relationships while still being true to your values and political beliefs, this workshop is for you!" Reena and Tom not only allowed us to create a viewing ticket for their workshop that others could continue to learn from it and also donated a valuable hands-on manual guide that can be used as a resource for all our followers.

Reena Bernards, works as a family therapist, specializing in relationship connections, inter-cultural families, and healing from trauma. She is certified in Emotionally Focused Therapy, as well as an AAMFT approved supervisor. She has lectured on "Responding Empathically to Survivors of Trauma" for the National Institutes of Health Office of Intramural Training and Education. Reena also works as a facilitator of inter-group dialogue and a trainer in diversity. She created the Common Ground Workshop for Braver Angels, which brings liberals and conservatives together for constructive dialogue. Reena brings the lens of attachment as a key human motivator to her therapy practice, as well as to her inter-group work.

**Tom Smerling** has had a long career in foreign and domestic policy. He was the founder of Project Nishma, a national organization that organized American Jewish leaders to advocate for more proactive U.S. peace diplomacy. He led several delegations of Jewish leaders to Jordan, Syria, Egypt, the West Bank and Gaza. After merging Nishma with Israel Policy Forum, he organized dialogues between Jewish leaders, Syrian-Americans, and Iranian academics. Tom subsequently worked in strategic planning for the Ocean Service of NOAA (National Oceanic & Atmospheric Agency). Most recently, Tom has held a variety of national volunteer positions with Braver Angels, which brings together liberals and conservatives for mutual understanding.

# October 30. 2024 Persephone's Choice Workshop: A Sacred Story Journey into the power of choice, sovereignty and the mythic imagination




In October, we were fortunate enough to have Australian storyteller and mythic explorer, Jacqui Bushell lead us into a deep exploration of the myth of Persephone. "Trace the heartline of this ancient myth

and what its metaphors and symbols inspire in your own life. Persephone's choice to eat the pomegranate seeds is a powerful pivotal moment within this ancient teaching story. Pulled in many directions by others, she must discover her powers of autonomy and sovereignty. Shedding naivety, she becomes a queen knowing the mysteries of life, death, and rebirth. When Persephone emerges in Spring's soft light, she carries with her the six seeds of new life. Her wisdom can also be your wisdom. To what will you say yes in life? What ripens for you in the hidden darkness of winter? This sacred story is a potent journey of claiming your innate authority, aligning yourself with your inner core of wise knowing and creative vision."

**Jacqui Bushell** has spent her life dancing with the mythic imagination, drawing on the wisdom of fairy tales and her work as a spiritual herbalist who listens to the voices and stories in the land. As a writer and speaker, she passionately encourages others to explore their own mythology at the borderlands of psyche, body, culture, and landscape. For 30 years, Jacqui has facilitated women's circles, ceremonies, retreats, workshops, and courses in Australia and internationally.

She guides people in awakening their creative soul essence through a deep connection with the mysteries of the earth, stories, and their own sacred nature. Bridging a broad range of skills—plant spirit alchemy, energetic healing, history and mythic philosophy, embodiment practices, and journey work—Jacqui inspires transformational shifts in how people see themselves and their world. Her empowering, experiential work invites you to come home to a profound sense of belonging and kinship with nature.

#### Nov 10.2024 Listening to our Anger Workshop



In November, just after the 2024 election, Elisa Pearmain offered a timely workshop on Listening to Our Anger. Here is her description of the workshop:

"Anger is an uncomfortable, often taboo, sometimes dangerous, and very necessary emotion. It informs us when our personal needs are not being met, when there is injustice, and when action is required. Anger often covers painful emotions, such as grief, powerlessness, shame, and fear. Understanding how our anger is trying to help us is a crucial step in the forgiveness/ healing process. By listening to our anger's stories with compassion and curiosity, we connect to what is important to us, and live more authentically."

Elisa Pearmain: began her storytelling career by working for ten years as a Storyteller in Residence in the Boston Public Schools. There she came to appreciate and tell stories from the many diverse cultures that the children represented. Elisa completed her Master's in Education in 1988 at Lesley University in the Creative Arts in Learning program with a concentration in Storytelling. She went on to teach for Lesley College through their national and local Creative Arts in Learning Master's program for 11 years, helping teachers to become storytellers, and integrating story into every aspect of the curriculum and classroom culture. Elisa published her first book *Doorways to the Soul: 52 Wisdom Tales from around the World* in 1998. It won the Storytelling World Honor Award for Anthologies in 1999.

Elisa's second book *Once Upon a Time: Storytelling to Teach Character and Prevent Bullying.* Lessons from 99 multicultural folk tales for grades K-8. (Character Development Group) was published in 2006, and won the Storytelling World Honor Award for Special Resources in 1997. Additionally, she recently recorded a double CD of stories and commentary on The Forgiveness Process.

Elisa also has a Master's degree in counseling and is a licensed mental health counselor, with a private practice in Concord, MA.

### **AUTHOR INTERVIEW SERIES 2024**

In July, HSA introduced a new author's interview series entitled: "When Storytellers Write About Healing". Live on ZOOM, through interviews and audience Q and A, we invited interviewers with a background in healing to meet with different authors to explore together their insights into the unique and powerful relationship between storytelling and healing. In our initial season, we successfully presented three different author interviews, from different disciplines and perspectives, deepening our understanding of what healing means, how it functions, and how storytelling can play a central role in the healing process.

#### July 31.2024

#### **Laura Simms Author Interview**

We kicked off our author's interview series with Jim Brule interviewing noted storyteller and author Laura Simms about her book, "Our Secret Territory: The Essence of Storytelling." Laura shared the inspirations and experiences that shaped her book, offering valuable insights into storytelling as a transformative and healing art. The conversation explored the depths of creativity, the connection between storyteller and audience, and the therapeutic impact of sharing stories.


**Laura Simms** is an acclaimed storyteller who The New York Times has called a major force in the revival of storytelling in America. Laura's way of telling a story allows the mind of the listener to rest in a realm of imagination beyond thought, and stimulates its faculties of kindness and relationship. In this book she examines the spiritual and social aspects of storytelling, and its process of engagement.



#### Aug. 21.2024 Jim Brule Author Interview

In August, we flipped roles, giving Laura Simms an opportunity to interview Jim Brule about his own book, "Stories of the Heart: Journey into Dying and Living". Co-authored with Rebecca Lemaire, this beautifully curated book of eighteen stories focuses on the dying and living, grief and healing.

Jim Brulé is a multifaceted individual whose life's work revolves around transformational storytelling, spiritual exploration, and end-of-life care. His life is a testament to the power of storytelling as a tool for healing, spiritual growth, and fostering understanding in a diverse world. His journey from a family therapist to a spiritual storyteller, death doula, and spiritual guide reflects a lifelong commitment to open-hearted healing and service. His motto, "The right story told in the right way with an open heart can heal wounds and change lives," encapsulates the essence of his life's work.



#### Dec 8. 2024 Noa Baum Author Interview

We finished out the year with Jo Radner interviewing Noa Baum about her book "A Land Twice Promised: An Israeli Woman's Quest for Peace."

A Land Twice Promised delves into the heart of one of the world's most enduring and complex conflicts. Baum's deeply personal memoir recounts her journey from girlhood in post-Holocaust Israel to her adult encounter with "the other." With honesty, compassion, and humor, she captures the drama of a nation at war and her discovery of humanity in the enemy. Winner of the 2017 Anne Izard Storytellers' Choice Award, among others, this compelling memoir demonstrates the transformative power of art and challenges each reader to take the first step toward peace.

**Noa Baum** grew up in Jerusalem in the shadow of the ancestral traumas of the holocaust and ongoing wars. Stories of the past and fear of annihilation in the wars of the '60s, '70s, and '80s shaped her perceptions and identity. In America, she met a Palestinian woman who had grown up under Israeli Occupation, and as they shared memories of war years in Jerusalem, an unlikely friendship blossomed.

Noa holds a BFA in theater from Tel Aviv University, was an actress with the Khan Repertory Theater of Jerusalem and studied with acclaimed acting teacher Uta Hagen in NY. She holds a Master of Arts in Educational Theater and Drama Therapy from New York University (NYU) and received a Graduate Fellowship working in inner city schools from C.A.T., (Creative Arts Team) the Theater in Education Company of NYU.

A sought-out performer, speaker, and trainer, Noa offers a unique approach to storytelling in communities and organizations. Since 1982, she has inspired and educated audiences of all ages with her performances, innovative keynotes, and transformative workshops.

As of Dec.31,2024 we have successfully completed our second full year as an IRS 501 c 3 cultural arts organization. With our dedicated team of volunteers and our small paid administrative staff to help with bookkeeping and promotion (Dot Cleveland), Healing Story Alliance is well positioned to continue its service work in 2025.

OARS in the Water and Kind Stories in Concert are to continue in 2025. Kind Stories will have a season from October to May. OARS in the Water will continue bi-monthly. New Special Ticketed Events are also on the horizon. As well as being mission aligned, these ticketed events contribute to our sustainability and produce additional income beyond our ongoing flow of small donations. Upcoming will be a solo concert by spoken word poet Anubis and a keynote by noted environmentalist Bill McKibben.

Aspirations for 2025 include:

- To continue the Author Interview Series in 2025. An interview with Dr. Annie Brewster and Dan Yashinsky are already in the planning stages.
- To continue to expand the base of co-hosts for OARS by drawing from the regularly attending community members.
- To continue to expand outreach to find more community tellers for Kind Stories in Concert.
- To look ahead and plan to expand our Special Ticketed Events to include a wide range of mission driven topics such as diversity, social justice, and the environment.

We are looking forward in 2025 to continuing and expanding the projects and programs we have already started. Plus, we are looking forward to exploring the possibility of utilizing the video archive of Kind Stories in new and creative ways.
